Notes from Karin:

At our last county meeting, the discussion was about the how, what, and why of the contact information that was asked for when inputting volunteer hours. Since our meeting, I asked Mike Maddox and here is his response:

"At this moment, I have not officially given instructions on how to input contacts. If you work with 20 folks for a class, you enter 20 into the box. If three of you work with the same 20 folks, you each enter 20 in the box. If the three of you work with the same 20 folks for three times, you each enter 20 into the box 3 times (or 60 each!). Not every project will have a number every time. You don't count working with other MGVs. Behind the scenes when projects are entered, an audience is specified for each project. I'll then know if these folks are adults, children, people with disabilities, veterans, etc. This is a very important number as it shows the ripple effect of the MG program and helps me tell the story that because of MGVs we are able to reach this many more people with horticulture information."

Level 1 Training: Amanda sent letters to names on our list who expressed interest so far in the training. If you know of someone who is interested, have them call the Extension Office at 723-
